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I. Background of the report

Through what is happening in some part of Haiti and around the world, all servant of Jesus-Christ who work for God's kingdom would agree with Eleanor Roosevelt statement: "You gain strength, courage and confidence by every experience in which you really stop to look fear in the face. You must do the thing you feel you cannot do." And I would reinforce this statement with the Scriptures that can be read in Philippians 4.13 "we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us". Furthermore, perseverance, especially during times of turmoil, involves maintaining determination and focus on a goal despite challenges, setbacks, and adversity. It's about pushing forward with resilience and a strong will, even when faced with difficulties, and not giving in to discouragement or despair.

The above facts are possible answers for anyone who wants to ask "How do you manage to continue working with communities in situations of unrest of any kind?" or we would simply like to answer "we don't know, except that Jesus did it so well and we are in joy!"

Despite many kinds of tribulations, IFOSUD Haiti continues to impacting lives of hundreds of people in its targeted communities with the gospel of Jesus-Christ t . Also, we continue to provide Technical Assistance to guarantee the well-being of our beneficiaries in the Farmer Field School Program (FFS_p) and school children in the Future Farmers of Haiti's program (FFH_p). For the quarter starting on April 1st, 2025 and ending on June 30th, 2025, we are pleased to share with you the achievements accomplished as well as the financial report over the reporting period.

II- Main activities the quarter

2.1 Evangelism program

For the believers in Jesus-Christ, the gospel is always a central priority. Therefore, Jesus' final instructions in Matthew 28:19 to the church were to go and make disciples through the whole world "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". At IFOSUD, we are following an integral prioritist approach: IFOSuD believes in integral mission—that this mission involves both word and deed. Put another way, we believe both caring for people and proclaiming the gospel matter. But we also know how easy it is to lose our focus on proclaiming the good news, and that loss can be magnified when crisis strikes.

IFOSUD continue to reach out communities for Christ. Our unique model is known on the name of "Evangelism through Social Actions (ESA)". The Evangelism through social actions program remains the reason why IFOSUD exists as Christ centered organization. Again, to reach out our targeted community for Christ, we used several mechanisms like Story-telling in small group (orality approach) of adults, memorizing bible verses, family conference, Christian movies projection, group devotions, group discussions and household discipleship visits. In addition, we have the AWANA (Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed) program which allowed us to reach the heart of the FFH children for Christ through weekly devotions and monthly AWANA club. Hereafters are the achievements from April 1st, 2025 to June 30, 2025.

As overall, we have achieved the following spiritual outcomes:

- ✓ 14 AWANA Club sessions with an average of 402 FFH children were taken place in the following school community: Morne Barbeau, Bongnotte, Mercery, Darbonne, Corail Lemaire and Fond'Oie schools.
- ✓ 122 FFH children came to Jesus-Christ and are being connected with local church in the school communities
- ✓ 969 household discipleship visits, in which 202 visit to Farmer Field School and 767 to FFH students.
- ✓ 7 evangelism movies projection with the FFH students throughout the school communities : Movie's title .- " Our Walk with Christ, episode 3 & 4"
- ✓ 50 Devotional meeting session with an average of 402 FFH students throughout 6 primary schools
- ✓ 66 devotions session with 163 adults Farmer Field School beneficiaries
- ✓ 22 single parents in the Farmer Field School Program have accepted Jesus-Christ as their savior and are willing to start planning their wedding according to God's perspective.
- ✓ 64 daily devotions sessions and bible study have been realized in IFOSUD office with all employees. For the second quarter, we have studied the following books: 1 Chronicles, 2 Chronicles and Ezra.

FFH Students come to Jesus-Christ!

For this second quarter, as part of the evangelism outreach program, the gospel was spread through several canals in order to connect the children with Jesus. As part of the AWANA Club program, we



include evangelism movies projection in order to get the full attention of the children. The title of the movies we use untitled “your walk with Jesus, Episode 3 & 4”. By the grace of God, from April 1st, 2025 to June 30, 2025, ***the Holy Spirit has convinced the heart of 19 FFH children and they gave their lives to Jesus-Christ with Joy.*** When we computed quarter 1 and quarter 2, a total of 122 children gave their

lives to Jesus, Praise God! However, most of the new converts don't have Christian parents; the spiritual leader in IFOSUD, with the agreement of the children's parents, has already connected these children to local church partners in the targeted communities.

122 FFH children from different school have accepted Jesus as their Savior!



The intention of marriage in the Farmer Field School

Based on our record, 53 active beneficiaries (33%) out of 163 in the Farmer Field School are living in couple without wedlock (not legally married); hence, they are still single mom and single dad. While teaching them about God's Holiness and His Will for the believers, twenty two (22) participants out of 53 registered single parents of the Farmer Field School have expressed their intention to engage in the bonds of marriage. They have not yet communicated a precise date for the holding of the wedding ceremony; and we know, it is a severe spiritual war. Some demonic spirits prevent these people from marrying physically. That's why we ask you to help them in your prayers so that God will help them to break this chain that prevents them from fully experiencing God's plan

for their lives. One can cite : *Altidor Fabiola, Versaint Andremise, La Croix Manise, Aurore Jean Luçon, Louis Fils Jonel, Mirtyl Edline and Forestal Mamenshina.*

However, in Haiti, social pressures and traditions serve as obstacles to prevent people from getting married. Among the social requirements: have a beautiful house, nice furniture, have financial means to feed the guests. Tradition does not value spiritual needs. It's as if the social demands are heavier than the spiritual ones. According to the biblical teaching that IFOSUD has communicated to them, it is God who instituted marriage and God created it for its glory and for the good of man. Therefore, the marriage must first please the one who was previously created it and inaugurated.

To encourage their unions IFOSUD is looking forward to have access to the following items:

- ✓ Wedding dress for the bride-to-be
- ✓ Suit for the future husband
- ✓ Shoes
- ✓ wedding rings

Whenever we have access to these mentioned-above items, we will plan jointly with the local church partner to organize very probably a collective wedding. Let's continue to pray about it.

2.2 FOLLOW UP WITH THE GENERAL PROJECT ACTIVITIES

A- Farmer Field School Program (FFS_P)

As a reminder, Farmer Field Schools (FFS) is a group-based adult learning approach that teaches farmers how to experiment and solve problems independently. Sometimes called “schools without walls”, in FFS groups of farmers meet regularly with a facilitator, observe, talk, ask questions, and learn together. Farmer field schools as an approach was first developed to teach Integrated Pest Management (IPM) techniques in rice farming, but it has also been used in organic agriculture, animal husbandry, and also non-farm income generating activities such as handicrafts, small business, ect.

Based on IFOSUD strategic plan, adults farmers in the Farmer Field School (FFS) are trained and equipped upon a period of two years; whereby, a maximum of 50 beneficiaries is selected based on specific criteria. In order to address their training needs, the group is usually split into 3 sub-sectors: Agriculture/ crop production, livestock and small business per target community. During

this quarter, we had Four main communities: NETIRANS (50 beneficiaries) and BOIS AUBE (46 beneficiaries) are located in Leogane; BUVETTE and CARREFOUR PRINCE (31; 36) beneficiaries respectively are located in Jeremie. However, in May 2025, the Leogane group has been graduated and currently it remains 67 beneficiaries in the Jeremie group.

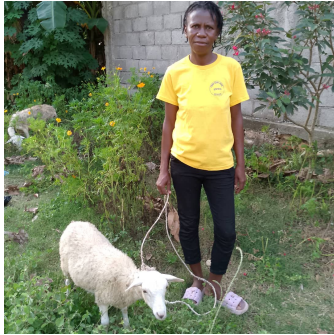

As a routine in IFOSUD strategic plan, after the graduation completion of a group of farmers, it is compulsory to kick off with a new group of farmers. From May to June 2025, series of field visits were conducted in order to explore communities that have potential to host FFS project. For the period of the report, three (3) focus group discussions were already carried out through 3 communities but only two communities (Nan Mapou & Laberger) will be kept to proceed with the Farmer Field School Program. During the next quarter, the field monitor will start with a survey in these communities in order to select the beneficiaries per sub-sector of activity.

▪ **LIVESTOCK. -**

Haiti's livestock sector plays a crucial role in the livelihoods of many Haitians and contributes to the country's food supply. Haiti's livestock sector is significant, with a national herd exceeding 4.6 million heads, dominated by goats, cattle, and pigs. Goats make up 45% of the total, followed by cattle (24%), pigs (23%), and sheep (8%). Poultry production also exists, and the sector has faced challenges, including an African swine fever outbreak in the late 1970s that decimated the pig population. According to the specialist in animal health and production, Harry Charles, this sub-sector becomes even more important with the decrease in yield per hectare of crops and that of productivity at the level of agricultural exploitation. Raising animal like goat, pig and sheep remain

one of the potential economic activity for the rural pro-poor in Haiti to rise out of extreme poverty mainly in the community where the dry season is longer over the year around. However, it faces challenges related to disease outbreaks, natural disasters, and access to resources and markets, requiring ongoing efforts to improve resilience and sustainability.



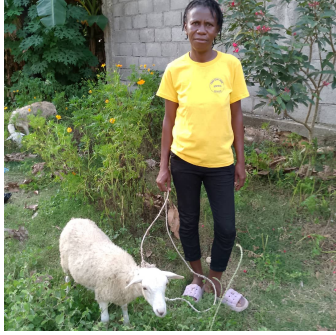
In Jeremie the farmers prefer to raise sheep, meanwhile in Léogâne they prefer to raise goat or pigs. For the Jeremie communities, we have 15 farmers in livestock. Each beneficiary has already received two goats as a loan to be repaid in kind during the implementation of the project. In short, for the period of the report 30 sheep were distributed as loan to the Jeremie group. From the field Monitor reports, we have collected 16 sheep as reimbursement in Jeremie, and all the 16 sheep were given back as loan to new beneficiaries. Interestingly, 94% of farmers in the livestock group are women.

Life changing story of a livestock farmer in Jeremie

Good evening everyone. I am Marie Guerdy Francois. Today, May 21, 2025, I am very happy to have the opportunity to give back a sheep as part of the livestock project with IFOSUD.



First of all, I want to say that I have 1 child, I am still a single mom, I am not accepting Jesus yet as my savior and I live with my child alone. Before I met IFOSUD, I used to do gardening and animal breeding. But I did them according to tradition but I had no practical knowledge about breeding. My animals used to always get sick and die. I always thought it was a fetish that killed them. But with IFOSUD, I learned the techniques well, what I used to think was a fetish

now I understand was a parasitic problem that was killing my goats. When you don't have knowledge, you are like someone walking in the dark. In addition, the spiritual training that I received from IFOSUD taught me a lot. My partner with whom I had one (1) child abandoned me and I said I would never forgive him, but the word of God taught me through IFOSUD that I must forgive those who hurt me. Since then, I have decided to forgive the father of my child. Only God can change people's heart. Now I pray to God for him, because I feel that I should accept Jesus some day and get married so that I can have a more orderly and disciplined life in God's face. My dream is to follow Jesus with all my heart and to encourage others to do the same, in addition to having a family that pleases God. Finally, I would like my livestock activity to grow so much that I can take care of my kid, I can create jobs for others and have a better life. I know that with God there is no failure and nothing is impossible for God. Thank you very much IFOSUD and all the IFOSUD supporters. May God bless you greatly!

SMALL BUSINESS

They are several thousands of Haitians who work in small business activities with meager means. In the majority of cases, it is women who leave their homes, very early in the morning, with a basket on their head, a bag or a large suitcase that contains some products that they are going to liquidate, and are walking in the streets. It is from these initiatives that they pay the rent, meet the needs of their children, especially their schooling.

The small business component in IFOSUD is used to performing very well. Based on the IFOSUD loan funds availability, our loan size varies from \$100 USD to \$ \$200 USD. In fact, For the Léogâne communities we had 48 beneficiaries in small business, meanwhile, in Jeremie, we have 25 beneficiaries. For the period of the report only the Leogane group that has remained active in the FFS program. All the small business group has already received

Life changing story of beneficiary in small Business

My name is Michel Marie Ceresse. I am a beneficiary in the small business group in Jeremie. I have 3 children. Before the IFOSUD program, my life was really difficult. My husband is a farmer and it is not easy to have good harvest. I used to do small business but it always goes bankrupt because the household charges used to be higher than the family earning. I can say, my family was living in extreme poverty. I couldn't feed my children; I couldn't provide for healthcare, I couldn't dress my children. But, I had hope because in my early age I accepted Jesus as my savior and I know how to live by faith.



One day I met with IFOSUD, it sounds like it is one answer to my prayers. I was offered technical training and spiritual training. I said a big YES like a marriage offer, haha! I started to take the IFOSUD small business training and the spiritual training seriously, since then I feel breathing a new air is thriving in my life. I have received a microloan of \$200 USD from IFOSUD, thanks to a small business plan I did under the supervision of Agronomist Gabriel. I can say my business is profitable and I even created 2 Jobs every day : I hire a mototaxi to take my products to the market, I hire another seller and I pay him based on volume sold. I am a boss at my level! Interestingly, me and my husband has started to build a little house from plastic batch (tarps) house to concrete house. It's not completed yet, but I feel it is something. I am so thankful for this program. The biggest thing ever, I got baptized recently thanks to the spiritual program of IFOSUD that encouraged me to do so. Thank you so much for all you do IFOSUD

TESTIMONY 2. Small business

My name is Jean Marie Benise. I have 8 children. I am married and live with my family. I persevere at



Bethel Church in carrefour Prince. I am a student of the IFOSUD Farmer Field School program in the small business group. This program interests me a lot and does not hurt me at all. Just as my church gives me biblical training, IFOSUD also does and but with more practice. It pleased me a lot! I am happy for all the encouragement IFOSUD gives me. In addition, the program to lend us money to do business, my friends, is there something more beautiful than that? to me, IFOSUD approach is words and actions. I

pray to God that it is not me who is doing wrong thing to discourage my trainer, Agronomist Gabriel. For example, if I borrow money and do not repay it, it will serve as a bad testimony for me and this can

discourage the agronomist. Help me pray that I remain sincere and honest and that God will pour out his grace more on me to share good wisdom with other beneficiaries like me.

AGRICULTURE

Haiti's economy is mainly based on agriculture, which employs approximately two thirds of the population. While 80% of the poor population in Haiti live in rural areas and are mainly employed in agriculture, this sector can play a decisive role in reducing poverty, increasing incomes and improving food security.

As we all know growing crops is the riskiest economic activity on earth. Mainly, if all production factors and inputs are not reliable. However, no matter how high is the risk the farmer will farm his land anyway. In fact, 28 farmers are in Jeremie learning and practicing the real agriculture. Some farmers were asking for cheap way to have access to banana seedlings at an affordable cost and in the shortest time possible. For this quarter, the technical team was experimented a new technique to produce seedlings for banana/ plantain as a way to address the needs of the farmers. This technique is known on the name of PIF. What is it exactly?

The PIF (Plants from Fragments) technique is a banana propagation method that involves fragmenting the banana bulb to produce several plants. This technique allows for intensive production of healthy shoots in a short time, approximately 3 to 4 months, with approximately fifty plants per bulb.

PIF Principle:

The PIF method uses banana bulb fragments to propagate plants.

- Rapid and intensive production of healthy plants.
- Production of numerous plants from a single bulb (on average, around fifty).
- Adaptability to local conditions and farmers' resources.

FARMER FIELD SCHOOL GRADUATION

For two years, a group of 76 beneficiaries were selected in Leogane to take part in the Agriculture and Discipleship training program of IFOSUD. It was difficult when we first started because of political instability, gangs terror, population fleeing from their homes,... The field agronomists, CANGE JEAN MAX & ROSEBERLINE BERNARD did the best of their abilities through their commitment to enable 59 beneficiaries to complete the program. So, the graduation took place this year on May 11TH, 2025 in the Discipleship and Agricultural Training Center of IFOSUD instead of March 16th, 2025 due to multiple gangs alert in the neighbourhood community of Leogane. Whereby, 59 beneficiaries out of 76, which represents 77.63 % of the total beneficiaries were eligible to graduate. However, for those farmers who failed to graduate, there will be a catch-up opportunity. These farmers will have the opportunity to graduate during the FFH program's student graduation this October. We always give all our beneficiaries a second chance to do something good.

Through the celebration of the 13th anniversary of IFOSUD, a spiritual festival was organized; more than 500 people from different structure of the Haitian society showed up without official invite to praise the living God with IFOSUD. We also had the opportunity to hear encouraging testimonies through several skits entertained by the graduate's. The biblical topic on which we preached on this year was ***"When darkness covers the land, God's light continues to shine. Taken from the book of Isaiah 60 verse 1***

Life changing story for the farmer Roseme Wilson



I am Roseme Wilson, I was among those who were picked by IFOSUD after a survey that was conducting in my community. One day, while passing through my area, Bois Aube, an investigator asked me what I do as economic activity in the area. They asked me many questions during the survey. A few days later, my name was selected among the beneficiaries in the agricultural sector. Since then, IFOSUD

has been doing great work with us. IFOSUD has been giving us training, such as how to prepare seeds, how to plant. One of the principles that I really like about IFOSUD is when they say they are not here to give charity or humanitarian aid; that means they are not here to give us a fish every day but to show us how to catch fish. I really appreciated this method. Indeed, we received good training in agriculture and it was something that was really great. There were many things we did not know how to plant properly. There is something that I have always kept in mind; bad weeds must not remain in the garden because they take all the good mineral elements from the soil. Normally we used to weed, clean, but we never knew the technical details and we used to be very negligent. But after knowing these details, I always weed my garden at the right time.

Then on the spiritual side, it was another good thing. We had our pastor who trained us, helping us through the gospel. For me it is a good spiritual serum. I remember the spiritual side very much. I give IFOSUD a big thank you for the entire good thing it accomplished in the communities. We really regret that IFOSUD had to stop the training after my graduation. I expect IFOSUD will be always there for us.

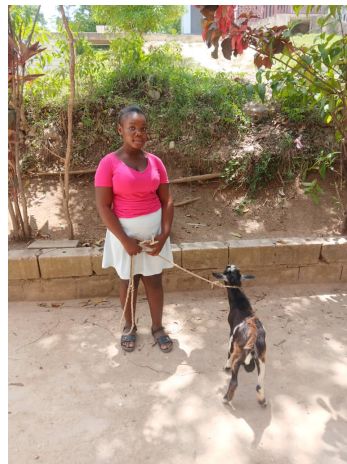
B. FUTURE FARMERS OF HAITI (FFH)

Within the framework of its interventions, IFOSUD implements an agricultural education project for the benefit of second cycle fundamental students at the level of the municipality of Léogâne. This project entitled "Future Farmers of Haiti/ FFH" intervenes in the following four (4) communal sections: Dessources (1st section), Petite Rivière (2nd section), Grande Rivière (3rd section), Gros-Morne (11th section) and Fond'oe (10th section). For its implementation, six (6) agronomist trainers are hired to conduct training sessions for students in the 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th year of elementary school. The objective is to enroll young people in the agricultural field in order to ensure the sustainability of agricultural operations. The latter have also benefited from training and awareness sessions on evangelism, which will allow them to have the necessary knowledge of the word of God.

For this quarter, we notice 402 active students in the FFH program in which 208 girls and 194 boys. We had a number of 600 students registered in the FFH program. We notice a drop of 200+ students who didn't attend Ag class. Our investigation let us understand that the instability in the country (Haiti) has a major impact on this matter. Some parents were obliged to move to another community with their children or to migrate to foreign country with the whole family. Hence, that leads to a little decline in the number of active students in the FFH program. For the quarter, we have 197 children who have a producing garden. In which we can count 28 that grows vegetables in recovery material and 169 in open field. The remaining students will start producing by the beginning of the third quarter. During that period 792 field visits were organize in order to guarantee the success of the FFH student gardens.

FFH SECOND GRADUATION ANNOUNCEMENT

We are thrilled to announce the second graduation of the FFH student on October 12, 2025. Currently, we don't know the exact number of students who will graduate because the results of the final text are not public yet. Also, we don't know who the top student will be, whether it will be a boy or a girl? Further, the best school should be revealed soon; the most successful FFH student will be known soon.. Coming up soon with more accurate details.

2.3.2 Irregular project

Irregular project is defined here as any partnership and /or being a winner through a call for tender or subsidy launched by another development organization in Haiti. In this manner this irregular projects can be totally or partly funded by a different organization. Even though this project purpose in the partners' perspective is not evangelism, IFOSUD takes this opportunity seriously as a way to tell more people about Jesus. For this quarter, IFOSUD still has a partnership with Reach Global.

 **Reach Global:** It is a one year renewable project where IFOSUD teaches the global fingerprint children about Christian education and Farming skills. For the period of the report, IFOSUD was responsible to support two groups of 30 children each (60 children total) to train them how to manage home gardens in order to help them to have something to eat and something to sell on a sustainable way.



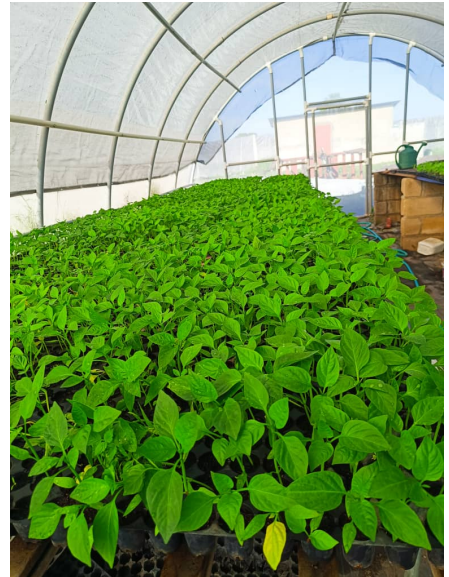
🌍 **Partners Worldwide:** Partners Worldwide is a global community of Christians dedicated to ending poverty by harnessing the power of business and sustainable partnerships.

This partnership seeks to strengthen IFOSUD's efforts to advance local agriculture by empowering farmers through increased crop productivity, improved market access, access to capital, and the adoption of innovative agricultural technologies. It aims to build resilient farming communities and promote sustainable economic opportunities by offering vital resources, including financial support, technical expertise, and capacity-building initiatives.

This partnership will allow IFOSuD to strengthen the capacity of our former graduates since 2014 to present in the Farmer Field School Program. We were saddened to see how these farmers were trapped in the cycle poverty even after their graduation. They had knowledge with very few financial means left to continue to make significant investment. Hence, this partnership is aiming to enhance their positions in the Agriculture value chain and to foresee further added value activities. During this quarter, IFOSUD got some preliminary findings from the survey and we will deepen the analysis by conducting few focus group discussions to validate the

IFOSuD UPDATE

3.1 Productive farm. - For this quarter the IFOSUD farm was into production despite the challenges. After harvesting Beetroot, Cabbage we had the opportunity to harvest the tomatoes and the Green peppers. For the quarter, seedlings seedlings of green peppers, cucumber, sweet corn have just transplanted and we expect to harvest in a few months.



IV- FINANCIAL REPORT

IFOSUD's balance sheet, also known as a statement of financial position, provides a snapshot of IFOSUD's financial health at a specific point in time. It outlines its assets, liabilities, and net assets. It also shows what the Organization owns. For the quarter ended on June 30th, 2025 the funds availability in its checking/ savings is \$ 44,086.16.

Also, from April 1st, 2025 to June 30th, 2025, IFOSUD has generated a total Gross Income of \$ 214,501.08 USD. The latter come from Grants received from FoI, IFOSUD productive farm, tractor revenue and revenue from other project in the form of loans reimbursement.
