# Farming Program: Banana Seedlings

28 farmers in Jeremie are learning and practicing real agriculture. Some farmers were asking for a way to have access to banana seedlings at an affordable cost and in the shortest time possible. For this quarter, the technical team experimented with a new technique to produce seedlings for banana/plantain as a way to address the needs of the farmers. This technique is known on the name of PIF. What is it exactly?

The PIF (Plants from Fragments) technique is a banana propagation method that involves fragmenting the banana bulb to produce several plants. This technique allows for the intensive production of healthy shoots in a short time, approximately 3 to 4 months, with approximately fifty plants per bulb.

The journey was long, and the sacrifices were invaluable. The agricultural professors and students established a strategy to make weekly school sessions and home visits possible. Despite the difficulties encountered, they did not give up. From 2020 to 2025, we are thrilled to count 148 total graduate so far in the FFH program. There are currently over 400 students enrolled!*
